Crisis in the Crowd

Luke 10:25-37

If you witnessed an emergency happening right before your eyes, you would certainly take some sort of action to help the person in trouble, right?

While we might all like to believe that this is true, psychologists suggest that whether or not you intervene might depend upon the number of other witnesses present.

This is known as the Bystander Effect 1

The term bystander effect refers to the phenomenon in which the greater the number of people present, the less likely people are to help a person in distress.

When an emergency situation occurs, observers are more likely to take action if there are few or no other witnesses. Being part of a large crowd makes it so no single person has to take responsibility for an action (or inaction).

BUT Jesus only identified 3 specific men who came upon this victim

- 1. Priest
- 2. Levi
- 3. Samaritan

So out of all that CROWD that passed by, only 1 man responded. Do you see that BYSTANDER EFFECT in action?

E – educate

2Timothy 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

Understand... not only important to educate long time church members, but also new converts... BECAUSE ZEAL WITHOUT WISDOM CAN BE DETRIMENTAL

T – Train – "on the job training" hands on

TRAIN – how to witness

How to be an effective ALTAR WORKER

How to PRAY someone through

Train our children too!!!! Train them in ALL ASPECTS OF MINISTRY

E – Emergency

RECOGNIZE an emergency when you see one. SAMARITAN recognized an emergency

ALSO – recognize PRE-emergency conditions. IF we can recognize PRE-emergency conditions, we might can prevent an actual emergency!

R - Respond

Don't just be a BYSTANDER.. do something. The Samaritan responded. ALL of us must respond.

N - Necessity

These are LIFE AND DEATH situations. Someone's soul is at stake – heaven or hell Samaritan knew this man could have died

I - Invest

Going to cost!

Samaritan used his own supplies, his own transportation, his own money

T - Time

This wounded man didn't get better immediately. Just because he had his wounds wrapped didn't mean he was healed. Be patient... LET THE BABY GROW!!!

Y - Yield

One day, it'll pay off. Psalms 126:6 He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.

The Final Exam²
