How To Be an Effective Altar Worker

- 1. Most important time of the service is the altar.
 - It is the climax of every service.
 - Preaching needs to draw souls to the altar for a response to the message.
 - Make the altar call special but simple, make it direct (stand, kneel, raise hands, which side to pray on).
- 2. Designated people to be prepared to come pray with individuals.
 - Whether you have a team of altar workers that rotate, someone needs to be prepared to pray with others.
 - Be ready to stop out quickly.
 - If you know the visitor than be willing to come pray with them. Ask them if they want to go forward and you will go with them.
- 3. Every altar worker must be spirit filled.
 - Must be led by the spirit to discern how you should pray.
- 4. Pray with the same gender unless family.
- 5. Be specific in your prayer. Ask the individual what you can pray with them about.
 - Salvation, healing, deliverance, baptism of Holy Ghost, encouragement.
- 6. Be quick to discern their need. You are not a counselor or therapist.
 - You may have to designate the pastor to come help you.
- 7. Stay focused on the prayer of their need. Use Scripture as your weapon!
- 8. The altar must be taught that it is a serious place/ sanctifying / place of victory/ place of peace. It is not a place of frivolity, a place to ignore, or a place to be afraid of. This is not a social gathering or a massage parlor.
- 9. Follow-up after the altar service is imperative.
 - Explain the altar experience. They might not understand how pray.
 - Encourage them write the date down and what God did for them.
- 10. Know how to lead someone in the sinner's prayer and how to receive the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
 - Use the word of God and be bold.
 - Use the Roman Road for salvation.
 - Use Acts 2 for seeking for the Holy Ghost.
